PETER ROTHSTEIN'S BOLD VISION FOR ASOLO REP

When Peter Rothstein became producing artistic director at Asolo Repertory Theatre in 2023, his vast experience gave him just the background he needed to guide Asolo Rep, the largest Actors' Equity not-for-profit theater in the Southeastern US, to exciting new heights.


For 25 years, Rothstein served as the founding artistic director of Theater Latté Da in Minneapolis. He directed 92 main-stage productions, including 14 world premieres. Peter is the creator of All Is Calm: The Christmas Truce of 1914, which received a Drama Desk Award for its off-Broadway debut. It has since been staged in more than 50 cities. Its broadcast version has been seen around the globe, airing on PBS.

Peter has worked extensively as a director of theater, musical theater, opera and new work development. He served on the board of directors for the National Alliance for Musical Theatre and has been a panelist and evaluator for many national theater festivals and awards. He holds degrees in music and theater from St. John's University and an M.F.A. in directing from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Asolo Rep productions span a diverse repertoire of new plays, bold reinterpretations of contemporary and classic works, and provocative musical theater experiences. It serves as a springboard for successful productions to travel to Broadway and other regional theaters throughout the country.

Asolo Rep takes full advantage of its ongoing partnership with the FSU/Asolo Conservatory for Actor

Training, which is ranked among the top 10 actor training programs in the country. Conservatory students undergo a rigorous threeyear Master of Fine Arts program, culminating with the third-year students' inclusion as part of Asolo Rep's mainstage company. This



unique collaboration has proven to be a successful formula for producing the highest quality professional theater while providing first-rate training for America's next generation of actors.

Now in his second full season here, Peter will share his vision for Asolo's future at our April 17 luncheon. Join us and get to know the talented and dynamic leader of one of the cornerstones of Sarasota's arts community!


Looking forward to April 2025:

Private Lido Key Art Collection

Pat and Ron Taylor have been collecting art for over 50 years, focusing on post-WWII abstract expressionists and figurative painters and contemporary art which developed out of these post-WWII innovations.

Their particular interest in paintings and objects lies in color and surface texture, and their sculptural objects expand on form and perception.

The collection, parts of which are displayed in homes in Sarasota, Chicago and Colorado, is wide-ranging. It includes art from the American Abstract Artists group in NYC and the Bay Area Figurative Movement in

San Francisco, with paintings by Giorgio Cavallon, James Weeks, David Park, Esteban Vicente and Hunt Slonem.

Contemporary pieces acquired locally in Sarasota include a Highwaymen painting by Sam Newton, Asian art collages by Jo Nelson, and paintings and constructions by other local artists.

Their Sarasota collection also includes paintings and objects from their travels throughout Vietnam, Morocco, Senegal, Europe, and Asia —often accompanied by delightful stories of acquisitions.



Libby Hawk's provocative abstracts on paper and canvas vibrate with color and texture, at once subtle and bold. She says, "I'm drawn to the challenges posed by working with diverse media – changing it up is essential to realize innovative ideas."

Feed Your Curiosity About Florida Art and Artists

If the recent art exhibits at Sarasota's City Hall sparked your interest in Florida art and artists, we provide the opportunity to see more.

Last year's Highwaymen display at City Hall was enthusiastically visited by record crowds. The Highwaymen were a small group of African American painters who, when not allowed to show their work in galleries of the 1950s and '60s, displayed their landscape paintings propped against their parked cars along Florida highways.

The current City Hall exhibit features Sarasota's own Petticoat Painters, one of the oldest women's art groups in the country. Established in 1953 when women also had difficulty exhibiting in galleries, the group continues to show the work of their 20 select members, whose admission is by invitation only.

If you'd like to see more original paintings from both noteworthy groups, visit the Arts Advocates Gallery. Admission is free and docents are available.

The Petticoat Painters will be showing their works in our gallery in May, Saturdays only, from 2 to 4 pm.
