### Creating Sarasota's Artistic Culture

Let's face it. One of the primary reasons we all live in the Sarasota area – right up there with the weather – is its abundance of arts. We are so fortunate to enjoy visual and performing arts on a par with (and arguably better than) much larger cities. How did this sleepy little beach community become home to world-class opera, ballet, theater, music, visual arts and more?

As part of Sarasota County's Centennial celebration in 2021, Arts Advocates partnered with actress and historian Kathryn Chesley to develop a presentation addressing that very question. As guest speaker for our May Zoom meeting, Kathryn will cover the development of all the visual and performing arts in the area, from the first painting of Sarasota to our most recent artistic endeavors.

Join us as we romp through the artistic evolution of our county through pictures and stories of the people, the places and the events that brought us our artistic roots. Then see how those roots grew and made Sarasota County the Cultural Coast of Florida.

A theater educator and trained actress with a love of history, Kathryn Chesley has earned a well-deserved reputation as a speaker and storyteller. Kathryn performs "Life and Times Portrayals" of historic women – Bertha Palmer, Marie Selby, Mable Ringling, suffragette Carrie Chapman Catt and more – in full period costume,

supported by historical research and accompanied by photographs. She is a member of the Sarasota Area Playwrights' Society, Asolo Theater Guild Play Readers, Friends of the History Center, the Historical Society of Sarasota County, The Venice Historical Society and the Sarasota Centennial Planning Committee. Kathryn is a national presenter with the National Women's History Alliance. She is also a local tour guide for Discover Sarasota Tours.

Both the in-coming and out-going boards will attend the May 13th board meeting but there have been, and will continue to be, numerous zoom meetings to coordinate plans for the coming months.

I have complete confidence in our wonderful new officers and board members. They bring a wealth of experience and abundant enthusiasm to their new positions and we are already working together to smoothly manage this transition.

On the board agenda is how to safely move from meeting virtually to meeting in-person again. We want to thank the 90 members who took time to share their thoughts and opinions through our recent survey.

### WELCOME NEW BOARD MEMBERS

Please join me in welcoming three new board members: Julia Groom, Director of Strategic Initiatives for Dream Large; William (Bill) Rusling, a member of the Advisory Council and Board of The Players Center for the Performing Arts; and John Lindsey who has experience managing information technology for large corporations.

Julia is an associate of Anand Pallegar who founded PINC and Dream Large. Many of you were introduced to Anand when he spoke at an Arts Advocates luncheon last year. Having Julia as a board member will give us an opportunity to tap into these inspiring, creative and community focused organizations.

Bill was Project Engineer for Selected Special Projects and Program Manager for Submarine Combat Systems for the Department of Naval Sea Systems Command in Newport, Rhode Island. He was a founding member of The Children's Theatre of Pawtucket Rhode Island, Chairman of the Entertainment and Membership Committees at the Newport Yacht Club and was recently voted Volunteer of The Year at the Players Theatre where he constructs sets for their plays and musicals.

### MEMBER SURVEY/LUNCHEONS AND EVENTS

In general, October is the month when most (32.14%) of the respondents would be comfortable attending in-person

events; however, both June (23.81%) and September (23.81%) were cited as favorable. This means we can plan to open up in June with masks, of course.

### LUNCHEON FEEDBACK

When asked if our meetings were too long, 79.76% of the respondents agreed. When asked if we should combine lunch with the speaker, 69.14% of the respondents agreed. This indicates that the Arts Advocates board has approval to modify the meeting format.

### LUNCHEON VENUE

Bird Key Yacht Club has lowered their minimum attendance for luncheons from 50 to 25 guests. In the past, Arts Advocates had to pay for a minimum of 50 lunches regardless of the number of attendees. Also, Bird Key has offered to maintain our price of \$29 per luncheon guest and we are unlikely to match this attractive offer at other venues.

There is the thought that members should have the benefit of paying \$29 for lunch and perhaps have non-members pay a surcharge of \$4 or a total of \$33 for lunch. This would help cover rental costs for items such as the piano and the audio-visual equipment.

### COLLECTION EXHIBIT SPACE

We have contacted The Connor Group, owners of The Siesta Mall, concerning leasing gallery space for one year. We propose creation of a special (pop-up) exhibit for this space honoring The Sarasota School of Art, an event that would be part of the Sarasota County Centennial celebration. Our collection of 15-20 Colony artists would be featured.

Estimated leasing costs are \$1,000 a month for one year plus utilities. The exhibit would be open to the public when staffed by volunteers 1 or 2 afternoons a week. Docent tours would be scheduled and paid for through our website. Board meetings, workshops and presentations would be scheduled on an individual basis.




